"Planted Teak Forests - a Globally Emerging Forest Resource"

Guanacaste, Costa Rica, 2-6 of May 2011

First Announcement

CATIE in cooperation with FAO and TEAKNET will organise in 2011 an international forestry conference that will focus on planted teak forests as a globally emerging forest resource. The conference will offer the opportunity to

- ✓ Meet international experts, investors and professionals in teak management and marketing
- ✓ Learn about experiences in other countries
- ✓ Establish contacts for networking and the development of new initiatives

Bringing together renowned global experts in teak (*Tectona grandis*) management and marketing, the Conference will provide an opportunity to exchange experiences, strengthen the teak sector by evaluating social, economic, technical and environmental issues and improve networking among its stakeholders by expanding TeakNet's coverage to Latin America and Africa.

Learning from past achievements will help shape a sustainable future for the sector, contribute to the effective use of donor support in future development projects and improve returns on investments. The Conference will contribute to the sustainable development of forest resources, in particular for the rural populations in teak growing countries, and will provide orientation for investors.

Conference Format

The conference will invite selected keynote speakers and welcome a limited number of technical papers that provide state-of-the art overviews of the main topics of interest. Both invited and volunteer presentations will be given in concurrent sessions during May 2 - 4. The conference will also welcome proposals for special sessions or side-events from organizations or groups.

A two days field trip is planned after the conference (May 5 - 6, 2011), which will provide excursions on various topics).

Participants are expected to arrive on Sunday, May 1st, 2011. Inscriptions, official speeches and a welcome cocktail will follow on Sunday evening.

Conference Topics

- Analysis of policy frameworks and related structural obstacles and financing barriers for Teak investments
- Analysis and evaluation of the role of investment intermediaries in promoting teak plantation ventures (case studies on successes and failures)
- Evaluation of private and public investments in the teak sector and its impacts on socioeconomic conditions and rural livelihoods
- Evaluation of existing management models and programmes for the production of planting material and genetic improvement
- Analysis of the market structures and value chains of teakwood trading and their impact on the profitability of Teak investments
- Development of uniform log grading rules and transparent market intelligence
- Evaluation of the significance of planted Teak forests for climate change adaptation and mitigation
- Developing strategic, conceptual and operational recommendations in support of the sustainable development of the Teak sector
